- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 to apply to the Nursing program.

- TEAS score of at least 58.7% is required for application to the Nursing program. Must be taken within 2 years of application date.

Each applicant's record will be reviewed according to the following criteria:

- Students must successfully complete all required prerequisite courses, including developmental courses, before the application deadline.
- All developmental courses and science courses that are taken must be completed with a "C" grade or better to be considered successful. If a developmental course or a science course is not successfully completed by the third attempt, the student will not be considered for admission. Attempts include withdrawals (W) and incompletes (I); all previous course attempts will be reviewed. Students who fail to submit transcripts for all previous coursework will not be considered for admission.
- Applicants must submit their final **high school** transcripts, GED, or the 30-college-credit option. If the applicant is an international student or has completed coursework outside the United States for high school, they must submit a course-by-course evaluation of their foreign transcript from Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE).
- Applicants must submit official transcripts from all previously attended schools. If transferring **college credits**, students must also request an Application for Credit Transfer from CCAC and have it evaluated prior to application to the Nursing program. International students or those with completed college coursework from outside the United States must first have their foreign transcript evaluated course-by-course from Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE) or World Education Services (WES).
- All applicants are asked to give multiple choices of campus and program (Day, Evening & Weekend, Fast Track) in the event their score does not place them within the limits of seat availability in their preferred choice of campus and program.
- Students must meet the following GPA requirements:
  - a. A cumulative 2.8 GPA minimum for a student who has earned 12 or more CCAC credits at the time of application
  - b. A 2.8 GPA minimum for a student who has not earned 12 or more CCAC credits but has earned 12 or more credits at other post-secondary institutions (this GPA will be a composite score representing all institutions attended)
  - c. A 3.0 GPA minimum from the secondary school (high school) for a student with less than 12 credits at a two- or four-year post-secondary institution(s)
- Applicants may be awarded additional points to their GPAs for admission to the Nursing program, based on their grades in BIO 161, BIO 162, and BIO 175. (See chart below.) In order to receive credit for these courses, they must have been completed with a grade of C or better within the past 10 years. If BIO 161 Anatomy and Physiology 1, BIO 162 Anatomy and Physiology 2 or BIO 175 Microbiology were completed prior to admission to the Nursing program, students must have completed them with a "C" grade or better within the past 10 years.
